Entry Payment:

By **check or money order** (US funds, made out to CAPER) or by **Zelle** (to secretary@caper-dogs.com). These methods have no extra fee. One check or Zelle payment is sufficient for all your dogs' entries.

By **PayPal or credit card** at caper-dogs.com, PayPal/Credit Card link. Please send a separate payment for the total of each dog's entries. **Payment must include \$2 per class additional charge for the entries to be valid.**

Entries must be received by 6:00 pm Wednesday, September 16 after which time no entries may be accepted, cancelled, altered, or substituted. No telephone or verbal entries will be accepted. All changes and cancellations must be received in writing (email is preferred) prior to closing, except as provided for in Chapter 11, Section 6 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows published by the American Kennel Club.

All entries must be on official AKC entry forms. Entries will be returned if they are illegible, incomplete, are submitted with incorrect fees, or are photocopied without the reverse side instructions and agreement included. Checks returned for insufficient fees will have the entry pended; acceptance of such an entry will only be made if the full fees, plus a \$25 administrative fee, are paid via Zelle, PayPal, certified check or money order & received prior to the start of judging. Express deliveries must include signature waiver permitting them to be left at the Secretary's address without receipt signature. **Entries received without signature release will be returned.**

Entries with email addresses will be acknowledged with an email receipt. CAPER is not responsible for non-delivery of emails due to delivery errors or spam blockers, and no further efforts will be made. Confirmations and judging schedules will be emailed after closing

Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded in the event of errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date; in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the veterinarian or judge, or barred from competition by the Show Committee; or in the event that extreme weather conditions, riots, civil disturbances, or other acts beyond the control of the Trial Committee make it impossible to open or complete the show/trial.

Entry Errors: Exhibitors are responsible for the correctness of entries. All entries which include an email address will be sent an entry verification email shortly after receipt. All errors will be corrected prior to closing; exhibitor errors discovered after closing cannot be corrected. Overpayments of less than \$5 per dog will not be refunded.

Transfers: Dogs which, according to their owner's records, have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for this show may be transferred from the Dog or Bitch class to the Best of Breed class. Transfers to a higher level in Junior Showmanship may also be made. Each of these transfer requests must be made to, and accepted by, the Show Secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of judging for the show in which to be moved.

Award of Merit: At the judge's discretion, the judge may award up to 1 Award of Merit for every 5 dogs entered in Best of Breed competition, after BOB, BOS, BOW & the Selects are awarded. All competitors in the ring for Best of Breed competition are eligible for this award if the judge desires to award it.

Non-Regular Classes

Classes divided by sex. Entrants may be altered. Winners eligible to compete in Best of Breed.
Veteran, 8 yrs & over

Best Puppy, Best BBE Puppy, Best BBE Adult, Best Veteran

First place in each 6-9 and 9-12 class will compete for Best Puppy

First place in Puppy BBE classes will compete for Best BBE Puppy

First place in Adult BBE classes will compete for Best BBE Adult

First place in each Veteran class will compete for Best Veteran

Points for Reserve Winners

Reserve Winners Dog & Reserve Winners Bitch will be awarded a three-point major, provided that the number of dogs competing in the regular classes of the reserve winners sex totals at least twice the number required for a 5 point major.

SWEEPSTAKES (Each Show)

Puppy Sweepstakes

Puppy Sweepstakes is open to all Schipperkes who are 6 months but less than 24 months old on the day of the sweepstakes. Dogs must also be entered in one of the regular classes at the regular entry fee. Classes are divided by sex.

6 mos & under 9 mos • 9 mos & under 12 mos
12 mos & under 18 mos • 18 mos & under 24 Mos

Veteran Sweepstakes

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all Schipperkes who are at least 8 years of age on the day of the Sweepstakes. Entrants may be altered and need not be entered in a regular class.

8 yrs & under 10 yrs • 10 yrs & under 12 yrs • 12 years & over

Distribution of Sweepstakes Prize Money

30% of total entry fees will be retained by Club for expenses.

The remaining 70% (for each Sweepstakes: Puppy & Veteran) will be awarded as follows:

Best in Sweepstakes: 25% • Best of Opposite Sex in Sweepstakes: 15% • First in each class: 5%
All cash prizes rounded to nearest dollar amount. Undistributed funds revert back to LSSC.

Indicate the Sweepstakes Class, with age division, in the space provided for Additional Classes on the entry form. Champions of record are eligible to compete.

FOUR-TO-SIX MONTH (BEGINNER PUPPY) COMPETITION (Each Show)

The Four-to-Six Month Puppy competition is for Schipperkes that are four months of age but under six months on the day of the event. An AKC registration number or an AKC litter number will be required for each entry. A foreign born dog may enter this class if they are registered in the country of origin.

- All entrants are to be vaccinated (including rabies) in accordance with their veterinarian's protocol.
- Dogs that are owned or co-owned by a professional handler may compete in this class, but must be handled by a non-professional handler. Dogs may not be exhibited by current assistants and household members of a professional handler. Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs/has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last 5 years.
- All entries must be received by the closing date. No entries will be taken at ringside.

Titles - The Certificate of Merit (CM) title is an introductory title to AKC conformation events. Entrants in each breed shall compete for Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed. Winners of the Best of Breed in each of the individual breeds or varieties will be awarded points toward the CM title based on the number of dogs defeated in their breed or variety. Winners of Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed in each of the individual breeds or varieties will be awarded points toward the CM title based on the number of dogs defeated in their sex.

The Certificate of Merit requires 15 points awarded in accordance with the following points structure.

Dogs Competing – Points: 2 dogs: 1 pt • 4 dogs: 2 pts • 8 dogs: 3 pts • 12 dogs: 4 pts • 16 dogs: 5 pts

AKC NATIONAL OWNER-HANDLED SERIES (Each Show)

The AKC National Owner-Handled Series is a non-titling competition for dogs that are exhibited by their owners that are not professional handlers.

All dogs that are owner-handled and are not owned, co-owned or exhibited by professional handlers* meet the requirements for this competition. Exhibitors must declare their dogs are Owner-Handled eligible at the time of entry using the check box on the entry form. Eligible dogs will be identified by an asterisk in the steward's book & the catalog. **Dogs must be handled throughout the breed level competition for the regular show by an eligible owner. Professional handlers, household members and assistants to current professional handlers may not exhibit the dog in any breed competition during the entire show.**

Owner-Handled Best of Breed will be selected from the dogs that are eligible to compete in the Best of Breed competition including Winners Dog, Winners Bitch and winners of the non-regular classes.

* Professional handlers are not permitted to exhibit in this competition. Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years. Dogs may not be exhibited by current assistants or household members of a professional handler.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP (Each Show)

Novice class: For junior handlers aged 9-17 who, at the time entries close, have not won three first place awards, with competition present, in a Junior Showmanship Novice class at a licensed or member show.

Open class: For junior handlers aged 9-17 who, at the time entries close, have won three first place awards, with competition present, in a Junior Showmanship Novice class at a licensed or member show.

Master class: For junior handlers aged 9-17 who, at the time entries close, have 10 first place wins in an Open class with competition. The calendar for this class will be November 1 - October 31 of the following year. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class.

PLEASE NOTE: Juniors must include their AKC Junior Handler number on the entry blank. Be sure all information for Junior Showmanship Classes is entered on the front and back of the entry form.

Dogs shown in Junior Showmanship may have Full or Limited AKC registration or have an ILP/PAL number. Altered animals are eligible to be shown, but bitches in season are not eligible.

RV PARKING

There is a limited number of Full RV hookups at a rate of \$35 per day. There are many electric only hookups for \$35 per day. SHOW SITE INFORMATION

The show site will be available to exhibitors at 7:00 am each day. All dogs must be removed from the show site immediately following judging on Sunday. No dogs allowed in the building overnight. No smoking is allowed in the building. If you smoke outside, do not leave your butts on the ground.

AKC Policy July 2026:

Dogs shall not be left unattended in a vehicle that is fully enclosed or without sufficient ventilation or airflow from the outside environment. A vehicle containing unattended dogs must provide continuous ventilation and conditions reasonably sufficient to protect the dogs from heat-related injury, illness, distress, or death. The presence of fans, air-circulation devices, climate-control systems, temperature-monitoring systems, remote alerts, or other electronic monitoring technology shall not, by itself, establish that a vehicle provides adequate ventilation or a safe environment for unattended dogs.

Leaving dogs unattended in a vehicle that is fully enclosed or without sufficient ventilation is recognized to be conduct prejudicial to the best interest of purebred dogs, the sport of purebred dogs and the American Kennel Club. Accordingly, individuals who engage in conduct which constitutes a violation of this policy may be subject to discipline pursuant to AKC's Charter and Bylaws.

RINGSIDE: Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging. Dogs allowed in ring during judging only. Dogs and crates may be brought ringside.

DogStack — Live Ring Updates



This show will be using DogStack, a live ring-tracking tool designed to help exhibitors stay informed about the progress of judging throughout the day. **It is free for exhibitors.**

As judging progresses, the ring steward will update DogStack when each class is completed. Exhibitors can check the live schedule from their phone to see how judging is progressing in the ring. We are excited to be invited to the pilot as this program launches. The App will be available for iPhone and Android devices in mid-August.

New World Screwworm Information

To assist exhibitors traveling home to states requiring **New World Screwworm inspections**, the Lone Star Schipperke Club is working to secure a licensed veterinarian who will be available **Sunday afternoon as judging concludes** to perform examinations and issue the necessary health certifications for eligible dogs.

Our goal is to make the process as convenient as possible by allowing exhibitors to complete the required examinations before departing the show grounds or nearby.

Additional details, including availability, scheduling, fees (if applicable), and any state-specific requirements, will be announced as they become available.

We appreciate your patience as we finalize these arrangements and will provide updates as soon as they are confirmed.

MEDIA: Videotaping by individuals for their own personal use will be allowed outside show rings only. The show committees reserve the right to regulate placement of cameras to prevent interference with traffic flow and exhibiting of dog.

AKC® Code of Sportsmanship and Civility

Preface: The tradition of competitive purebred dog events predates 1884—the year the American Kennel Club (AKC®) was founded. Those involved in these sports share core values, including a strong commitment to sportsmanship and a welcoming, respectful culture that embraces the diverse community united by a love of dogs.

These values are evident across all aspects of the sport: conformation, performance, companion, and family dog activities. Many believe that the enduring principles of sportsmanship and civility are key reasons the sport has thrived for over 140 years.

Recognizing that periodically reaffirming our shared values strengthens our community, the revised code will be shared widely to highlight the foundational values and principles that define the sport.

- Sportspeople always place the welfare of their dog above all else.
- Sportspeople prioritize the long-term health and preservation of their breed, making decisions that reflect a deep commitment to responsible breeding and ownership.
- Sportspeople respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportspeople conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on the sport, the American Kennel Club, and themselves.
- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.
- Sportspeople understand, uphold and abide by all AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies.
- Sportspeople contribute to a positive atmosphere at events by avoiding negative gossip, disparagement, or unsportsmanlike behavior.
- Sportspeople extend their values of civility, fairness, and respect to all digital and social media platforms.
- Sportspeople actively support the education and mentorship of newcomers, helping them learn the rules, values, and traditions of the sport in a respectful way.
- Sportspeople recognize that they are role models in the sport, and strive to lead by example through humility, kindness, and ethical conduct.
- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.
